Make your practice session harder than the real game. Instead of just beating balls in a general direction on the range, give yourself very specific targets to aim at whenever you practice. Aim for an imaginary fairway 20 yards wide and see how many drives out of 10 you can get within the fairway. This will give you evidence of your progress and will also get your mind used to dealing with tight driving holes and pressure situations.

Answer: It is unlikely that Michele's ball did not move since she stepped on it. When a player causes her ball to move, there is a one-stroke penalty and the ball must be replaced [Rule 18-2a]. Failure to replace the ball before hitting it would result in a two-stroke penalty. A shadow is not a movable obstruction. It is a distraction, and players should take care that their shadows not fall on the hole when attending a flag stick, or on another player's line of putt while she is putting. If a player finds another player's shadow distracting, there is nothing stopping her from asking the other player to move. The moving player is not exempt from penalty if she happens to step on her ball.

DON'T FORGET - Be good to our course; replace divots, rake bunkers and repair ball marks.
