Golf Buddies Needed! We're looking for ladies to volunteer to be a "golf buddy" for ladies new to Juniper. As with every organization, JHLGC receives new ladies who wish to be a part of one or both of the golf leagues. Setting up a "golf buddy" program will ensure that our newest members feel welcome and will have someone to show them the procedures for league/tournament play. Hopefully this will entice them to return for the next league day play!

Golf clubs might be needed by new ladies joining our league. If you have a set, or a partial set, that you would consider allowing someone to borrow, please let Michele, Becky or Teresa know.

JHGC COURSE NOTES:

1. You have 5 minutes to look for a lost ball.
2. If you hit into the water on # 13 TWO times, go to the other side of the water and right of bridge for the drop zone. Add appropriate # of strokes to your score. (The ball you hit into the water counts as one stroke, the ball in the water counts as another stroke, and the ball you must hit again counts as another stroke) Basically it's a one stroke penalty.
3. When the ball is between the red fence posts (yes, they're there) along the cart path and the fence on #11, you have the option of playing it as it lies or you may take cart path relief to the right of the cart path without penalty. There is no drop zone. This is a JHGC course rule.
4. If a ball goes out of bounds you must re-hit from the original position. This is called stroke and distance. (Example: You're on #2 tee. You hit a ball out of bounds. The ball you hit out of bounds counts as one stroke, the ball out of bounds counts as another stroke, so the ball you must re-tee and hit counts as another stroke) Basically it's a one stroke penalty.

Uneven Ground – Side hill Lies

When faced with an uphill or downhill lie, it is common for amateur golfers to either hit the ball fat or thin. The mishit is most often caused by an error in the setup position.

Making sure that your shoulders are *parallel to the ground* on which you are hitting from and **not** parallel to the horizon is of the utmost importance. By setting up in this position you are in fact mimicking a flat surface with respect to the body to ground relationship. This allows the lowest portion of the swinging club to be achieved at the ball rather than before or after, and thus reduce the chance of hitting the ball fat or thin.

The Juniper Cup – 2014

The Juniper Cup is a season-long competition for members of the Juniper Hill Ladies Golf Association.

- By May 31, 2014, all members of the JHLGA will be assigned to a Juniper Cup team.
- Team members earn points for participation in league play; participation in Club events/tournaments; winning in league play; winning in Club events/tournaments. Members must choose one league (if they play in both) to count for Juniper Cup purposes.
Team Captains will be named. The role of the team Captain is to encourage member participation.
- Juniper Cup standings will be updated regularly and posted on the website.
- The Juniper Cup team with the most points at the end of the season wins “The Juniper Cup.” The team’s picture will hang in the JH Clubhouse until a new winner is named next year.

Here’s how you earn points:

Activity	Points Earned
Play in designated regular league	5
Play in JHLGC one -day event	10
Play in JHLGC two -day event	20
Win 1st gross/net in JHLGC one -day event	20
Win 2nd gross/net in JHLGC one -day event	10
Win 3rd gross/net in JHLGC one -day event (if awarded)	5
Win 1st gross/net in JHLGC two -day event	40
Win 2nd gross/net in JHLGC two -day event	20
Win 3rd gross/net in JHLGC two -day event (if awarded)	10
Win 4th gross/net in JHLGC two -day event (if awarded)	5

Answer: Aggie was correct. A ball is “in play” as soon as the player makes a stroke from the teeing ground [Definition of “Ball in Play”]. A “stroke” is defined as the forward movement of the club with the intention to hit the ball. There is no requirement that the ball be hit in the definition of “stroke.” Indeed, a complete whiff is still a stroke.

The player makes a stroke at the ball. It is now in play. When she picks it up and re-tees, she has lifted her ball in play, a one-stroke penalty under Rule 18-2a. If she were to take the ball off the tee and replace it in the divot, the penalty would remain at one stroke. However, she hit the ball from the tee. The penalty for failure to replace the ball is two strokes [breach of Rule 18]. When Ally hit her ball from the tee the second time she was hitting her fourth stroke on the hole.

DON'T FORGET - Be good to our course; replace divots, rake bunkers and repair ball marks.
