The Practice Range: Focus on your finish

One of the biggest faults that most players have in their swing is not getting to a full finish.

If we look at other sports, in all of them when a player throws a ball or any object toward a target, they get their shoulder to point at the target. This is a must to keep the ball online. It also shows that the player has released the club through the ball and not at the ball. I have all of my students focus on getting to a full finish. This not only keeps the ball online but it also generates a powerful shot, so make sure when you practice to make your finish a priority.

Obsolete Golf Rules: 1744-1952

The rules of golf are updated every four years by the Royal & Ancient G.C of St Andrews. They keep in mind "fairness of play". Here are five that were removed or altered over time.

- You may carry (use) as many clubs you feel necessary during the round. The 14 club rule was introduced in 1939, a huge break for the caddies!
- You are not to change the ball that you strike of the Tee. Meaning, you played the whole round with one ball (unless lost) even if it was badly damaged
- When a ball is within 20-yards of the hole, the flag stick must be removed. The unfortunate golfer with poor eyesight was at a disadvantage here
- You must Tee your ball within a club length of the hole. This basically tells us that the green was also the Tee Box for the next hole!!
- Stymie. This occurred when another ball was directly in the putting line of your ball (not within 15cm of each other). The ball was not lifted or marked. Therefore, you had to putt around of chip over the opponent's ball. This was eliminated in 1952.

Answer: When a ball in motion on a putting green is deflected by a moving or animate outside agency, cancel the stroke, replace your ball, and replay [Rule 19-1b].

If the same thing were to happen to a ball in motion that is not on the putting green, you must play the ball as it lies. This is what is known as a "rub of the green."

DON'T FORGET – Be good to our course; replace divots, rake bunkers and repair ball marks.
