10 things In the bag

-  If it's nice, and no sign of rain, keep your rain gear in the car. That way you won't get weighed down.

-  Carry only the number of golf balls that coincide with your handicap -- unless it's greater than a dozen, then only bring a dozen.
-  A sharpie marker. Not to sign autographs, but to mark your ball.
-  A clean towel. If you wet the end you can clean your ball and club heads as you go. You may want to bring a second towel on hot days to cool yourself.
-  A ball marker. Sometimes they are on your gloves. There are pretty ones you can buy for your hat. Don't be that gal who marks her ball on the green with a tee.
-  A divot tool. Enough said.
-  Rangefinder or GPS Device. These are a good tool for every skill-level of golfer.
-  A snack. Everyone needs extra fuel on the links.
-  Water! The key is to stay hydrated and healthy!


JHLGC event - teams will be assigned from both JHLGC and JHGA. Players must sign in by 8 a.m., shotgun start at 8:30 a.m.

September 19-20

The Ladies Club Championship is September 19-20 for the members of our two ladies' leagues at Juniper Hill Golf Course. To participate, you must meet the following

qualifications:

1. Be a member of either the Wednesday Ladies Day League or the Thursday Late Swingers League; AND
2. You must have played three times in the Wednesday Ladies Day League; OR
3. You must have played six times in the Late Swingers League; OR
4. You must have a combination of 2 or 3 above to equal three 18-hole league plays; AND
5. Those with a current handicap must have three 18-hole scores posted in the USGA Golf Handicap & Information Network (GHIN) for the current year (March 1 - September 15, 2015).
6. One 18-hole play in a JHLGC-sponsored tournament may be used toward the league play requirement (will count for one play in the Wednesday league and two plays in the Late Swingers league).
7. Any former Ladies Club Champion, as long as she is a current member in good standing of either the Wednesday Ladies Day League or the Late Swingers League, may qualify without having met the minimum number of league plays requirement

Getting that "do-over" ??

JHLGC Situation #11

On Hole #4, Dawn and Trina are facing long putts above the hole. Trina putts first and hits it too hard and the ball rolls off the green into the greenside bunker. She doesn't feel comfortable with her sand wedge, so she putts another ball from the same spot and says "I will just take the one-stroke penalty." Dawn does not think that procedure is allowed and tells Trina she has to play her original ball. Who is correct?

JHLGC Situation #8

Trina is correct. According to Rule 27-1, at any time a player may under penalty of one stroke, play a ball as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played. If the original stroke was played from the putting green, the ball must be placed. If the stroke was made from a hazard or through the green, the ball must be dropped. If the stroke was made from the teeing ground, the ball may be played from anywhere within the teeing ground and may be teed. (Rule 20-5)
